hen looking at some of the goals Boro have scored this season it would be easy to have grave suspicions about the integrity of some of the opposing players.

How else to explain Frank Sinclair's bizarre own goal in the 1-0 win against Leicester? Or Verón's day-dreaming that handed them the winner at Old Trafford? Not forgetting the defensive lapse that allowed Robbie Mustoe to secure the points at Derby.

Of course, there is no

suggestion of any collusion. The good luck that was absent during Boro's relegation-FA Cup Final-League Cup final season of 1996-97 has finally found its way to the North East and is making up for lost time. It seems that Lady Luck is settling in quite nicely by the Tees.

But it is more than luck: for the first time in a good few years, Middlesbrough are now looking like a Premiership outfit. Two years ago, Bryan Robson's squad cost around £51m and finished 12th. Steve McClaren's squad cost

around £30m (£14m of which was spent on Ehiogu and Southgate) and could finish higher.

However, in terms of quality at a low cost, look no further than two loan players who have made a fantastic contribution. The influence of Franck Queudrue and Benito Carbone cannot be underestimated and it is inconceivable that both will not be full time Boro employees at the beginning of next season. Queudrue's passing, vision and work-rate has won him many admirers, while Carbone's ball skills remind the faithful of Juninho in his prime.

Boro go into the penultimate month of the season with Premiership status assured, a mid-table finish likely, and with an outside shot of creeping into Europe. And the fans that staved away earlier this season are becoming convinced of the benefits of spending Saturdays at the Riverside instead of
